

Our Anglican Statement of Faith

XVII. Predestination and Election. Predestination to Life is the everlasting purpose of God, whereby He has decreed by His secret will that He will rescue from curse and damnation those He has chosen in Christ for eternal salvation. Therefore, those who have been given such an excellent gift of God are called by His Holy Spirit at work within them, so that through grace they respond to the calling, are freely justified and made children of God by adoption. They are being remade into the image of His only begotten Son Jesus Christ, and they walk religiously in good deeds, and eventually, by God's mercy, they reach everlasting happiness.

The careful consideration of Predestination and our Election in Christ is full of sweet, pleasant and indescribable comfort to godly people and those who feel within themselves the working of Christ's Spirit, killing off the deeds of the flesh and their earthly inclinations, and drawing their minds upwards to high and heavenly things. It also greatly establishes and confirms their faith in eternal salvation to be enjoyed through Christ, and also fervently kindles their love of God.

XVIII. Obtaining eternal Salvation only through the Name of Christ. Those who say that every human being will be saved by the Law or Religion he professes because he is careful to frame his life according to that Law and the light of nature, must be considered cursed. Holy Scripture sets out clearly that it is only the Name of Jesus Christ by which people must be saved.

XIX. The Church. The visible Church of Christ is a gathering of faithful people, in which the pure Word of God is preached, and the Sacraments are properly administered according to Christ's ordinance, in all those things that are necessary for them. Just as the Churches of Jerusalem, Alexandra and Antioch have erred, so also has the Church of Rome erred, not only in their way of life and their ceremonies, but also in matters of Faith.

XX. The Authority of the Church. The Church has the power to decree rites or ceremonies, and authority in determining controversies in matters of Faith. However, it is never lawful for the Church to order anything that is contrary to God's Word written, neither is it allowed to teach one part of Scripture so that it contradicts another. Therefore, although the Church is a witness and guardian of Holy Scripture, yet just as it ought never to enforce anything against Scripture, neither should it enforce the belief of anything beyond Scripture as necessary for Salvation.

¹ After this I looked, and behold, a door standing open in heaven! And the first voice, which I had heard speaking to me like a trumpet, said, "Come up here, and I will show you what must take place after this." ² At once I was in the Spirit, and behold, a throne stood in heaven, with one seated on the throne. ³ And he who sat there had the appearance of jasper and carnelian, and around the throne was a rainbow that had the appearance of an emerald. ⁴ Around the throne were twenty-four thrones, and seated on the thrones were twenty-four elders, clothed in white garments, with golden crowns on their heads. ⁵ From the throne came flashes of lightning, and rumblings and peals of thunder, and before the throne were burning seven torches of fire, which are the

seven spirits of God, ⁶ and before the throne there was as it were a sea of glass, like crystal.

And around the throne, on each side of the throne, are four living creatures, full of eyes in front and behind: ⁷ the first living creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the third living creature with the face of a man, and the fourth living creature like an eagle in flight. ⁸ And the four living creatures, each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all around and within, and day and night they never cease to say, "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!"

⁹ And whenever the living creatures give glory and honor and thanks to him who is seated on the throne, who lives forever and ever, ¹⁰ the twenty-four elders fall down before him who is seated on the throne and worship him who lives forever and ever. They cast their crowns before the throne, saying, ¹¹ "Worthy are you, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they existed and were created."

THE ATHANASIAN CREED, pp. 769-771

The People Stand

Celebrant Let us confess our faith in the words of the Athanasian Creed:

Whosoever will be saved, *

before all things it is necessary that he hold the Catholic Faith. Which Faith except everyone do keep whole and undefiled, *

without doubt he shall perish everlastingly.

And the Catholic Faith is this: *

That we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity, Neither confounding the Persons, *

nor dividing the Substance.

For there is one Person of the Father, another of the Son, *

and another of the Holy Ghost.

But the Godhead of the Father, of the Son,

and of the Holy Ghost, is all one, *

the Glory equal, the Majesty co-eternal.

Such as the Father is, such is the Son, *

and such is the Holy Ghost.

The Father uncreate, the Son uncreate, *

and the Holy Ghost uncreate.

The Father incomprehensible, the Son incomprehensible, *

and the Holy Ghost incomprehensible.

The Father eternal, the Son eternal, *

and the Holy Ghost eternal.

And yet they are not three eternals, *

but one eternal.

As also there are not three incomprehensibles, nor three uncreated, *

but one uncreated, and one incomprehensible.

So likewise the Father is Almighty, the Son Almighty, *

and the Holy Ghost Almighty.

And yet they are not three Almighties, *

but one Almighty.

So the Father is God, the Son is God, *

and the Holy Ghost is God.

And yet they are not three Gods, *

but one God.

So likewise the Father is Lord, the Son Lord, *

and the Holy Ghost Lord.

And yet not three Lords, *

but one Lord.

For like as we are compelled by the Christian verity *

to acknowledge every Person by himself to be both God and Lord, So are we forbidden by the Catholic Religion, *

to say, There be three Gods, or three Lords.

The Father is made of none, *

neither created, nor begotten.

The Son is of the Father alone, *

not made, nor created, but begotten.

The Holy Ghost is of the Father and of the Son, *

neither made, nor created, nor begotten, but proceeding.

So there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; *

one Holy Ghost, not three Holy Ghosts.

And in this Trinity none is afore, or after other; *

none is greater, or less than another;

But the whole three Persons are co-eternal together *

and co-equal.

So that in all things, as is aforesaid, *

the Unity in Trinity and the Trinity in Unity is to be worshipped.

He therefore that will be saved *

must thus think of the Trinity.

Furthermore, it is necessary to everlasting salvation *

that he also believe rightly the Incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

For the right Faith is, that we believe and confess, *

that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is God and Man;

God, of the Substance of the Father, begotten before the worlds; *

and Man, of the Substance of his Mother, born in the world;

Perfect God and perfect Man, *

of a reasonable soul and human flesh subsisting;

Equal to the Father, as touching his Godhead; *

and inferior to the Father, as touching his Manhood.

Who, although he be God and Man, *

yet he is not two, but one Christ;

One, not by conversion of the Godhead into flesh, *

but by taking of the Manhood into God;

One altogether; not by confusion of Substance, *

but by unity of Person.

For as the reasonable soul and flesh is one man, *

so God and Man is one Christ;

Who suffered for our salvation, *

descended into hell, rose again the third day from the dead. He ascended into heaven, he sitteth on the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, *

from whence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead. At whose coming all men shall rise again with their bodies * and shall give account for their own works.

And they that have done good shall go into life everlasting; * and they that have done evil into everlasting fire.

This is the Catholic Faith, *

which except a man believe faithfully, he cannot be saved.
